- Pursuing Revival In Our Day
- We must remove the rubbish from our lives 44
- True sanctification means perfect love, perfect obedience, perfect conformity 45
- 46 to the will of God. We are to be sanctified to God through obedience to the
- 47 truth. Our conscience must be purged from dead works to serve the living
- 48 God. We are not yet perfect; but it is our privilege to cut away from the
- 49 entanglements of self and sin, and advance to perfection. Great
- 50 possibilities, high and holy attainments, are placed within the reach of all.
- 51 { AA 565.1}
- 52 Will the human agent cooperate with the divine "to will and to do"? If man
- places his will on God's side, fully surrendering self to God's will, the 53
- 54 high and holy endeavor of the human agent takes down the obstruction
- he himself has erected, the rubbish is cleared away from the door of the 55
- 56 heart, the defiance barricading the soul is broken down. The door of the
- 57 heart is opened and Jesus enters, to abide as a welcome guest. { HP 27.6}
- 58 Love of the world
- 59 The love of the world has crowded out the love of Christ. When the
- 60 rubbish is cleared away from the door of the heart, and it is thrown open
- in response to the invitation of Christ, He will come in and take possession 61
- 62 of the soul temple. { 4T 617.2}
- 63 Confess
- 64 [The Lord] rebukes, He chastens; but it is only that He may restore and
- approve at last. How glad my heart was made by the report from the General 65
- Conference that many hearts were softened and subdued, that many made 66
- 67 humble confessions, and cleared away from the door of the heart the
- 68 rubbish that was keeping the Saviour out. { TM 22.2}
- 69 God is infinitely gracious. He waits for us to return to him by heart-
- 70 **humiliation, confession, and repentance**. { YI April 4, 1905, par. 7 }
- A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of 71
- 72 all our needs. To seek this should be our first work. There must be earnest
- effort to obtain the blessing of the Lord, not because God is not willing to 73
- bestow His blessing upon us, but because we are unprepared to receive it. 74 Our heavenly Father is more willing to give His Holy Spirit to them that ask 75
- 76 Him, than are earthly parents to give good gifts to their children. But it is our 77 work, by confession, humiliation, repentance, and earnest prayer, to
- 78 fulfill the conditions upon which God has promised to grant us His
- 79 **blessing.** { 1SM 121.1}
- Make things right with other church members. 80
- 81 When difficulties arise among church-members, let them be cleared
- 82 away before the Sabbath comes. This should be regarded as a Christian
- 83 duty by every church-member. "Let the peace of God rule in your hearts, and
- be ye thankful." Are you troubled and perplexed? Sweep away the 84

- 85 rubbish that has been accumulating before the door of the heart, and
- open the door, inviting Jesus to come in and abide as an honored Guest.
- 87 Bring peace and comfort into your own hearts and the hearts of others. This
- 88 is most blessed missionary work. { AUCR April 15, 1903, par. 12 }
- 89 The Lord has instructed me to say to his people, Work for perfection. Do
- 90 **nothing that will cause disaffection to spring up in hearts**. Do not serve
- 91 the enemy. Overcome your inclination to find fault and condemn. Give
- 92 no place to him whose delight it is to accuse. Remember, my beloved
- 93 brethren and sisters, that you are pleasing and helping Satan by every word
- 94 you utter that disparages another. { RH July 21, 1904, par. 10 }
- 95 Try it in every church. Have special meetings when you can,—meetings of
- 96 humiliation, of afflicting the soul,—meetings where the rubbish shall be
- 97 cleared away from the door of the heart, that the blessed Saviour may
- 98 **enter.** { RH December 16, 1884, par. 14 }
- 99 Remove rubbish from the mind
- He must put out of his life all superficial reading, for if his mind is filled
- with trash the Holy Spirit cannot work and impress the mind with truth,
- and bring right things to the memory. He is beginning to form an appetite
- 103 for trashy reading—an appetite like the inebriate's. He cannot possibly
- 104 understand the Word and practice the truth, bringing it into the home life
- and having a mind for prayer—being instant in prayer. { 1888 1814.2 }

What is an idol?

- 108 An idol is anything that human beings love and trust in instead of loving
- and trusting in the Lord their Maker. Whatever earthly thing men desire
- and trust in as having power to help them and do them good, leads them
- away from God, and is to them an idol. Whatever divides the affections, or
- takes away from the soul the supreme love of God, or interposes to prevent
- unlimited confidence and entire trust in God, assumes the character and takes
- the form of an idol in the soul temple. { 3SM 330.2}

What are some modern day idols?

- 118 In rejecting the truth, men reject its Author. In trampling upon the law of
- 119 God, they deny the authority of the Law-giver. It is as easy to make an idol
- of false doctrines and theories as to fashion an idol of wood or stone.
- 121 { DD 29.1 }
- 122 Reverencing Sunday is idol worship
- 123 The Protestant world have set up an idol Sabbath in the place where
- 124 God's Sabbath should be, and they are treading in the footsteps of the
- 125 Papacy."—Letter 90, 1897.
- 126 Idol of our own opinions
- 127 Rather than give up some cherished idea, or discard some idol of
- opinion, many refuse the truth which comes down from the Father of
- light. They trust in self, and depend upon their own wisdom, and do not
- realize their spiritual poverty. { DA 280.1}

- Homes can become idols
- 132 Our Creator demands our supreme devotion, our first allegiance. Anything
- which tends to abate our love for God, or to interfere with the service
- due Him, becomes thereby an idol. With some their lands, their houses,
- their merchandise, are the idols. Business enterprises are prosecuted with
- zeal and energy, while the service of God is made a secondary consideration.
- 137 Family worship is neglected, secret prayer is forgotten.—(SDA Bible
- 138 Commentary 2:1011, 1012.)
- 139 Money
- 140 Mammon is the idol of many. The love of money, the desire for wealth, is
- 141 the golden chain that binds them to Satan. Reputation and worldly
- 142 honor are worshiped by another class. The life of selfish ease and
- 143 freedom from responsibility is the idol of others. But these slavish bands
- 144 **must be broken**. We cannot be half the Lord's and half the world's. We are
- not God's children unless we are such entirely. { SC 44.1}
- 146 Men are robbing God; and with self-complacency they look up and say,
- "Wherein have we robbed thee?" The answer comes from him, "In tithes and
- in offerings." There are men in the ranks of Sabbath-keepers who are
- 149 holding fast their earthly treasure. It is their god, their idol; and they
- love their money, their farms, their cattle, and their merchandise better
- 151 than they love their Saviour, who for their sakes became poor, that they,
- 152 through his poverty, might be made rich. They exalt their earthly
- treasures, considering them of greater value than the souls of men. Will
- such have the "Well done" spoken to them? No; never. The irrevocable
- sentence, "Depart," will fall upon their startled senses. Christ has no use
- 156 for them. They have been slothful servants, hoarding the means God has
- 157 given them, while their fellow-men have perished in darkness and error.
- 158 { RH March 14, 1878, par. 2}
- 159 Our feelings can be idols
- 160 I tried to impress upon the people that a happy flight of feeling is no
- 161 evidence that we are in favor with God. We must have the living, divine
- principles ever abiding in us, and not make an idol of impulse or of a high
- degree of feeling. If we have pardon, we must show repentance. We must
- 164 have faith, and walk by faith; not entertain the idea that we must have
- assurance in feeling before we acknowledge ourselves blessed of God. The
- assurance is in God's word. God has said, and it will be done.
- We can make celebrities idols
- 168 From the wisest king that ever swayed a scepter, **Solomon became a despot.**
- 169 As a king he had been the idol of the nation, and that which he said and
- 170 **did was copied.** His example exerted an influence the result of which can be
- fully known only when the works of all shall come in review before God.
- and every man shall be judged according to the deeds done in the body. { 7T
- 173 218.1}
- 174 Our appetites can be idols
- 175 Many have lost their spiritual discernment by making an idol of the
- 176 stomach. The poor stomach does not care to be idolized in this way. It

- wants a chance to carry forward its work in the beautiful order which
- 178 God has established. It will do this work if man will act like a rational
- being. The food which is taken into the stomach should be of a character to
- promote health, intelligence, and spirituality. { 2SAT 153.1 }
- 181 A favored person can be an idol
- Love ... is not unreasonable; it is not blind. It is pure and holy. But the
- passion of the natural heart is another thing altogether. While pure love will
- 184 take God into all its plans, and will be in perfect harmony with the Spirit
- of God, passion will be headstrong, rash, unreasonable, defiant of all
- restraint, and will make the object of its choice an idol. { AH 50.5}
- 187 Fashion
- 188 Worldlings teach their children to love display, and to bow to the idol of
- 189 fashion. They sacrifice themselves and their children upon this altar of
- 190 Moloch. But Christians who profess to be seeking the heavenly Canaan,
- should obey the instructions of the Bible. We urge modern Israel to lay aside
- their ornaments, their jewels of silver and gold and precious stones, to put off
- their costly-apparel, and to seek for the inward adorning, even the ornament
- of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price. Let
- 195 children be educated, not to become devotees of fashion, but to be
- 196 **servants of God.** { ST May 26, 1881, par. 23 }
- 197 Luxurious living and extravagant dress are carried to such an extreme
- as to constitute one of the signs of the last days. Those who are inclined to
- admire the appearance which they make in a mirror will have no inclination
- 200 to test their characters by looking into the great moral mirror, the law of God.
- 201 The wicked idol of dress swallows up all that is humble, needy, and lowly
- 202 in the character. It consumes the precious hours which should be
- 203 devoted to meditation, searching the heart, and prayerful study of the
- 204 Scriptures. { 19MR 325.1 }
- 205 Education
- 206 In educational pursuits as in all others, selfish, earthly aims are dangerous to
- 207 the soul. In educational lines many ideas are advanced which proceed not
- 208 from the High and Holy One who inhabiteth eternity, but from those who
- 209 make scholastic studies an idol and worship a science that divorces God
- 210 from the education. Yet because these errors are clothed in an attractive
- 211 garb, they are widely received.... { CTr 23.3}
- 212 Position
- 213 Pride of position is a deep-seated evil which has ruined thousands. Yes.
- 214 tens of thousands, full of ambition for distinction and display, have been
- 215 ruined because they have lost sight of principle. They have measured
- themselves among themselves, and compared themselves with themselves.
- 217 Their eager grasping for credit and reward has resulted in diminished
- 218 **spirituality**. { 2SM 184.3}
- 219 Amusements
- 220 Instead of using their God-given powers to devise means that they could
- accomplish good and communicate that which they had received worshiping
- 222 God in Spirit and in truth, they ate and drank and rose up to play. They

- 223 perverted and misapplied the rich grace of God, and bowed their soul's
- 224 powers to worship an idol just as Satan laid his plans they should do
- 225 through resuming their amusements in games and plays which led away
- 226 from watchfulness and prayer. { 1888 1211.2 }
- 227 Self
- 228 The workers are never to make an idol of self, but are to put on Christ
- Jesus all working harmoniously.-Letter 150, 1901, pp. 1, 2.
- 230 There are many represented to me in the church who seem just like drowning
- 231 men engaged in a desperate struggle to keep their heads above water. They
- 232 have not in their religious life ever died to self. Self is their idol; they
- worship at its shrine. Weakness and a fluctuating experience open the way
- 234 for Satan's temptations and they will be easily overcome. A faithful waiting
- 235 upon the Lord will renew their strength. Trials of faith will come, but
- love, patience, and constancy will be weighed by the golden scales of the
- 237 heavenly sanctuary. { DG 137.2}

We must give them up!

Our carnal hearts would cling to, and seek to carry along, our idols; but we cannot advance until we put them away; for they separate from God. The Great Head of the church has chosen his people out of the world, and required them to be separate. He designs that the spirit and life of his commandments shall draw them to himself, and separate them from the elements of the world. To love God and keep his commandments is to be far from loving the world's pleasures and friendship. There is no concord between Christ or Belial. The people of God may safely trust in him alone, and without fear press on in the way of obedience. { RH February 18, 1862, Art. A, par. 6}

Why is it hard to give up idols?

For a time many who have only a superficial faith, appear to be charmed with the truth; but when the word of God points out some cherished sin, and rebukes some chosen course of action, or requires self-denial and self-sacrifice, they are offended. As the truth is brought home to the conscience, they see that some idol of their hearts must be sacrificed, renounced, if they become the followers of the Lord in deed and in truth, and they cling to the idol, and put aside the warnings of the Spirit of God. They look at the present inconvenience and trial, and forgot the eternal realities, and begin to measure themselves among themselves, and conclude that they are as good as those who make a profession of religion, and so reject the requirements of the gospel. { RH June 7, 1892, par. 6 }

Individuals are tested and proved a length of time to see if they will sacrifice their idols, and heed the counsel of the True Witness. If they will not be purified through obeying the truth, and overcome their selfishness, their pride and evil passions, the angels of God have their charge, "They are joined to their idols, let them alone," and they pass on to their work, leaving them with their evil traits unsubdued, to the control of evil angels. Those who come up to every point, and stand every

test, and overcome, be the price what it may, have heeded the counsel of the True Witness, and they will be fitted by the latter rain for translation. { 2SG 272 225.1 }

How do we give up our idols?

The truth should be placed before the people in its true, elevated position. All should constantly seek for the true faith that works, not by an earth-born, emotional element, but by love that purifies the soul. This love cleanses the soul-temple from pride, and expels every idol from the throne of the heart. { RH March 11, 1902, par. 3 }

Our sorrows do not spring out of the ground. In every affliction God has a purpose to work out for our good. Every blow that destroys an idol, every providence that weakens our hold upon earth and fastens our affections more firmly upon God, is a blessing. ... We should receive with gratitude whatever will quicken the conscience, elevate the thoughts, and ennoble the life. { RH April 10, 1894, par. 9 }

286 The Lord purifies the heart very much as we air a room. We do not close 287 the doors and windows and throw in some purifying substance; but we 288 open the doors and throw wide the windows and let heaven's purifying atmosphere flow in. The Lord says, "He that doeth truth cometh to the 289 290 light." The windows of impulse, of feeling, must be opened up toward 291 heaven, and the dust of selfishness and earthliness must be expelled. The 292 grace of God must sweep through the chambers of the mind, the 293 imagination must have heavenly themes for contemplation, and every 294 element of the nature must be purified and vitalized by the Spirit of 295 **God**. {Ms8c-1891 (July 26, 1891) par. 17}

296 The Word of life, grasp it as the treasure house of infinite wisdom and 297 love; this is the Guidebook which will point out the paths to heaven. It 298 outweighs all the treasure of the universe. It points us to the sin-pardoning 299 Saviour, saying, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the 300 world." O that you would search the Scriptures with prayerful hearts, 301 and a spirit of surrender to God. O that you would search your hearts as 302 with a lighted candle, and discover and break the finest thread that 303 binds you to worldly habits, which divert the mind from God to idols. 304 Plead with God to convict you of every practice which draws your 305 thoughts and affections from God. God has given His holy law to man as 306 His measure of character. By this law you may see any defect in your 307 character and overcome it. You may sever yourself from every idol and 308 link yourself to the throne of God by the golden chain of grace and 309 **truth.** {Ms49-1895.4}

Be not discouraged because your heart seems hard. Every obstacle, every internal foe, only increases your need of Christ. He came to take away the heart of stone, and give you a heart of flesh. Look to Him for special grace to overcome your peculiar faults. When assailed by temptation, steadfastly resist the evil promptings.... Cry to the dear Saviour for help to sacrifice every idol and to put away every darling sin. Let the eye of faith see Jesus standing before the Father's throne, presenting His

- 317 wounded hands as He pleads for you. Believe that strength comes to you
- 318 through your precious Saviour.... {AG 84.5}
- 319 When man places himself under the control of God, the will becomes
- 320 firm and strong to do right, the heart is cleansed from selfishness, and
- 321 **filled with Christlike love**. The mind yields to the authority of the law of
- 322 love, and every thought is brought into captivity to the obedience of
- 323 **Christ.**" {OHC 104.3}
- 324 Jesus says, "Without me ye can do nothing" (John 15:5). Union with Christ
- 325 is our only means for overcoming sin. Living in Christ, adhering to
- 326 Christ, supported by Christ, drawing nourishment from Christ, we bear
- 327 fruit after the similitude of Christ. We live and move in Him; we are one
- 328 with Him and one with the Father. The name of Christ is glorified in the
- 329 believing child of God. This is Bible religion. {TMK 318.4}

330331

What will be the result?

332 God alone can lead you to so recognize His mercy, love, and forbearance 333 that you will have the faith that works by love and purifies the soul. This 334 is the gift of God. It is the opening of the heart to receive the Word which is 335 as the leaves of the tree of life. ... Believing in Christ and receiving His 336 transforming grace is not guesswork, but a work which causes Christ's 337 virtues to be reflected in mind and character. When you gain this 338 experience you will say, "I have tasted and seen that the Lord is good. The 339 Lord Jesus shall be my portion forever." {18MR 79.2,3} ... The power of 340 the cross will move in you the mysterious springs of hope and fear, 341 adoration and love. Angels are watching and waiting and will witness to the 342 fact that the world has you not. Jesus has found you sitting at His feet to 343 learn from Him, the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Henceforth, surrendering 344 your will to the will of Christ, you are drawn into a region where the 345 cross is the central object. The world fades from your view. The glory 346 shining from the threshold of heaven is the all-attractive influence. The 347 riches of the grace of Christ hold you in willing obedience. You delight in 348 the precious blessings of your allegiance. You are only too glad to impart to 349 others the gift you have received. {18MR 80.1} ... Let your mind come 350 fully and habitually under the belief that Christ loves you. As you make 351 a full surrender of your will to God's will, your way to God's way, you 352 will learn of Him who is meek and lowly in heart, and will find rest unto 353 your soul. (Matthew 11:29). A calm confidence will preside over you. Your 354 heart will possess a dignity to which before it was a stranger. You will 355 experience more and more clearly the sense of an ever-present, all-pervading 356 Saviour. This will give the soul power to hold its stability, power which 357 the changing circumstances of earth cannot undermine. It plants the feet 358 upon a solid rock. {18MR 81.5} ... Then you can sing with the spirit and 359 with the understanding also. Under all discouraging circumstances your 360 heart will rejoice in your Saviour. You will find opportunity to speak 361 words of hope to the weary and the desponding. {18MR 82.1}
