1 Matt. 7:7-8 “Ask and it shall be given....”

2 Eph. 3: 20 “...able to do exceedingly abundantly....”

3 Luke 1: 37 “With God, nothing is impossible.”

4

5 “Prayer is a heaven-ordained means of success. Appeals, petitions,
6 entreaties, between man and man, move men and act a part in
7 controlling the affairs of nations. But prayer moves heaven.” *In*
8 *Heavenly Places*, 75

9

10 “Prayer is heaven’s ordained means of success in the conflict with
11 sin and the development of Christian character. The divine
12 influences that come in answer to the prayer of faith will accomplish
13 in the soul of the suppliant all for which he pleads. For the pardon of
14 sin, for the Holy Spirit, for a Christlike temper, for wisdom and
15 strength to do His work, for any gift He has promised, we may ask;
16 and the promise is, ‘Ye shall receive.’” *Acts of the Apostles*, 564.1

17

18 “The people of God have accustomed themselves to think that they
19 must rely upon their own effort, that little help is to be received from
20 heaven; and the result is that they have little light to communicate to
21 other souls who are dying in error and darkness. The church has
22 long been contented with little of the blessing of God; they have not
23 felt the need of reaching up to the exalted privileges purchased for
24 them at infinite cost.... The power of God awaits their demand and
25 reception.” *Testimony to Ministers*, 174.2

26

27 “The idea that prayer is not essential is one of Satan’s most
28 successful devices to ruin souls.” *My Life Today*, 31.4

29

30 His Answers—Sometimes “Yes,” Sometimes “No,”
31 Sometimes “Yes, But Later”—Are Assured!

32

33 Mark 11: 24 “...believe that you have received them, and you will
34 have them.”

35

36 “He makes it plain that our asking must be according to God’s will;
37 we must ask for the things that He has promised, and whatever we
38 receive must be used in doing His will. The conditions met, the
39 promise is unequivocal.” *Education*, 257.7

40

41 “If (we) have complied with the conditions upon which these
42 promises are based, God’s word is pledged that He will do for (us)
43 more than (we) ask.” *Gospel Workers*, 1892, 423.3

44

45 “In the future life the mysteries that here have annoyed and
46 disappointed us will be made plain. We shall see that our seemingly
47 unanswered prayers and disappointed hopes have been among our
48 greatest blessings.” *Ministry of Healing*, 474.1

49

50 Christ Adds His Prayers To Our Prayers

51

52 1 John 2:1 “... if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father,
53 Jesus Christ the righteous.”

54 Heb. 7:25 “... he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come
55 unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for
56 them.”

57 Heb. 4:15 “For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize
58 with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet
59 without sin. 16 Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace,
60 that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.”

61

62 “Christ is the connecting link between God and man. He has
63 promised His personal intercession. He places the whole virtue of
64 His righteousness on the side of the suppliant. He pleads for man,
65 and man, in need of divine help, pleads for himself in the presence
66 of God, using the influence of the One who gave His life for the life
67 of the world. As we acknowledge before God our appreciation of
68 Christ’s merits, fragrance is given to our intercessions. As we
69 approach God through the virtue of the Redeemer’s merits, Christ
70 places us close by His side, encircling us with His human arm, while
71 with His divine arm He grasps the throne of the Infinite. He puts His
72 merits, as sweet incense, in the censer in our hands, in order to
73 encourage our petitions. He promises to hear and answer our
74 supplications.” *Testimonies for the Church*, vol. 8, 178.2

75

76 “The prayer and praise and confession of God’s people ascend as
77 sacrifices to the heavenly sanctuary. But they ascend not in spotless

78 purity. Passing through the corrupt channels of humanity, they are
 79 so defiled that unless purified by the righteousness of the great High
 80 Priest, they are not acceptable by God. Christ gathers
 81 into the censer the prayers, the praise, and the sacrifices of his
 82 people, and with these he puts the merits of his spotless
 83 righteousness. Then, perfumed with the incense of Christ's
 84 propitiation, our prayers, wholly and entirely acceptable, rise before
 85 God, and gracious answers are returned." *Youth Instructor*, April 16,
 86 1903, par. 12

87

88 "Jehovah ... has placed at His altar an Advocate clothed in our
 89 nature. As our intercessor, Christ's office work is to introduce us to
 90 God as His sons and daughters. He intercedes in behalf of those who
 91 receive Him. With His own blood He has paid their ransom. By
 92 virtue of His merits, He gives them power to become members of
 93 the royal family, children of the heavenly King. And the Father
 94 demonstrates His infinite love for Christ by receiving and
 95 welcoming Christ's friends as His friends. He is satisfied with the
 96 atonement made. He is glorified by the incarnation, death, and
 97 mediation of His Son. In Christ's name our petitions ascend to the
 98 Father. He intercedes in our behalf, and the Father lays open all the
 99 treasures of His grace for our appropriation, for us to enjoy and to
 100 impart to others." ... No sooner does the child of God approach the
 101 mercy-seat than he becomes the client of the great Advocate. At his
 102 first utterance of penitence and appeal for pardon, Christ espouses
 103 his case, and makes it His own, presenting the supplication before
 104 the Father as His own request." *Signs of the Times*, April 14, 1909,
 105 par. 1,2,5

107 This Is The Pathway To Answered Prayer

108

109 1. We must ask.

110

111 Jer. 33:3 "Call ... and I will answer...."

112 Ps. 50:15 "Call ... [and] I will deliver you...."

113 Matt 7: 7-11 "Ask and it will be given to you...."

114 James 4:2 "...you do not have because you do not ask...."

115

116 "It is part of God's great plan to grant us, in answer to the prayer of
 117 faith, that which He would not bestow did we not thus ask." *Great*
 118 *Controversy*, 525

119

120 "To pray aright, is to ask God in faith for the very things you need.

121 Go to your chamber, or in some retired place, and ask your Father
122 for Jesus' sake to help you. There is power in that prayer that is sent
123 up from a heart convinced of its own weakness, yet earnestly
124 longing for that strength that comes from God. The earnest, fervent
125 prayer will be heard and answered." *Youth Instructor*, March 1,
126 1856

127

128 "The summing up of the benefit of prayer is that devotion that leads
129 to faith in God's promises. This faith is the key that opens the divine
130 treasury, is the hand by which we appropriate to our use the richest
131 gifts of God. The prayer of the contrite heart unlocks the treasure
132 house of supplies, and lays hold of omnipotent power." *Signs of the*
133 *Times*, June 18, 1896 par. 8

134

135 "Keep your wants, your joys, your sorrows, your cares, and your
136 fears before God. You cannot burden Him; you cannot weary Him.
137 He who numbers the hairs of your head is not indifferent to the
138 wants of His children. "The Lord is very pitiful, and of tender
139 mercy." James 5:11. His heart of love is touched by our sorrows and
140 even by our utterances of them. Take to Him everything that
141 perplexes the mind. Nothing is too great for Him to bear, for He
142 holds up worlds, He rules over all the affairs of the universe.
143 Nothing that in any way concerns our peace is too small for Him to
144 notice. There is no chapter in our experience too dark for Him to
145 read; there is no perplexity too difficult for Him to unravel. No
146 calamity can befall the least of His children, no anxiety harass the
147 soul, no joy cheer, no sincere prayer escape the lips, of which our
148 heavenly Father is unobservant, or in which He takes no immediate
149 interest." *Steps to Christ*, 100.1

150

151 2. We must ask according to God's will.

152

153 1 John 5:14-15 "...if we ask anything according to His will, He
154 hears us."

155

156 "Prayer and faith are closely allied, and they need to be studied
157 together. In the prayer of faith there is a divine science; it is a
158 science that everyone who would make his lifework a success must
159 understand. Christ says, "What things soever ye desire, when ye
160 pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them." Mark
161 11:24. He makes it plain that our asking must be according to God's
162 will; we must ask for the things that He has promised, and whatever

163 we receive must be used in doing His will. The conditions met, the
 164 promise is unequivocal.” *Education*, 257.7

165

166 “Be not discouraged if your prayers do not seem to obtain an
 167 immediate answer. The Lord sees that prayer is often mixed with
 168 earthliness. Men pray for that which will gratify their selfish desires,
 169 and the Lord does not fulfill their requests in the way which they
 170 expect. He takes them through tests and trials, he brings them
 171 through humiliations, until they see more clearly what their
 172 necessities are. He does not give to men those things which will
 173 gratify a debased appetite, and which will prove an injury to the
 174 human agent, and make him a dishonor to God. He does not give
 175 men that which will gratify their ambition, and work simply for self-
 176 exaltation.” *Review and Herald*, November 19, 1895 par. 9

177

178 “Said Christ, ‘If any man serve Me, him will My Father honor.’
 179 When we come to Him we should pray that we might enter into and
 180 accomplish His purpose, and that our desires and interests might be
 181 lost in His. We should acknowledge our acceptance of His will, not
 182 praying Him to concede to ours.” *Counsels on Health*, 378

183

184 3. We must ask in Jesus’ name.

185

186 John 16: 23,24 “... whatever you ask the Father in My name He will
 187 give you.”

188 Heb. 4: 16 “Let us therefore come boldly....”

189

190 “Christ has opened the way for us to approach God. He says, ‘Make
 191 use of My name. It will be your passport to the heart of My Father
 192 and to all the riches of His grace.’” *Signs of the Times*, June 18, 1902

193

194 “He explained that the secret of their success would be in asking for
 195 strength and grace in His name. He would be present before the
 196 Father to make request for them. The prayer of the humble
 197 (petitioner) He presents as His own desire in that soul’s behalf.”
 198 *Desire of Ages*, 667

199

200 “The Lord Jehovah accepts the argument that is presented in the
 201 name of his Son, and places the resources of his merit at your
 202 command. It is our privilege and duty to bring the efficacy of the
 203 name of Christ into our petitions, and use the very arguments that
 204 Christ has used in our behalf. Our prayers will then be in complete
 205 harmony with the will of God. Then it is that Christ clothes the

206 contrite suppliant with his own priestly vestments, and the human
207 petitioner approaches the altar holding the holy censer, from which
208 ascends the incense of the fragrance of the merit of Christ's
209 righteousness." *Signs of the Times*, June 18, 1896 par. 8

210

211 4. We must ask in faith.

212

213 Mark 9: 23 "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who
214 believes."

215 Matt 9:29 "Then touched He their eyes, saying, According to your
216 faith be it unto you."

217 James 1:6 "But let him ask in faith...."

218

219 "Prayer is the key that unlocks the storehouse of heaven. The
220 churches have been losing their power. We must have faith in God.
221 We must have a firmer dependence on Him who is the Owner of the
222 universe. The cause of God needs consecrated workers, and it needs
223 money. What shall we do? Pray in faith, believing that as we
224 advance, the means and the workers will come. Let us lay the whole
225 situation before God, because He alone can supply that which we
226 must have in order to enter new fields. He says, Advance, and we
227 are not to wait till the money is in sight. There is to be no failure on
228 our part." *Manuscript Releases*, vol. 18, 338.4

229

230 "God desires us to receive great blessings. His promises are so
231 clearly stated that there is no cause for uncertainty. He desires us to
232 take Him at His word. At times we shall be in great perplexity and
233 not know just what to do. But at such times it is our privilege to take
234 our Bibles, and read the messages He has given us; and then get
235 down on our knees, and ask Him to help us. Over and over again He
236 has given evidence that He is a prayer-hearing and prayer-answering
237 God. He fulfills His promises in far greater measure than we expect
238 to receive help." *The Paulson Collection*, 174

239

240 "When our prayers seem not to be answered, we are to cling to the
241 promise; for the time of answering will surely come, and we shall
242 receive the blessing we need most. But to claim that prayer will
243 always be answered in the very way and for the particular thing that
244 we desire, is presumption. God is too wise to err, and too good to
245 withhold any good thing from them that walk uprightly. Then do not
246 fear to trust Him, even though you do not see the immediate answer
247 to your prayers. Rely upon His sure promise, 'Ask, and it shall be
248 given you.'" *Prayer*, 102.2

249

250 “True faith lays hold of and claims the promised blessing before it is
 251 realized and felt. We must send up our petitions in faith within the
 252 second veil and let our faith take hold of the promised blessing and
 253 claim it as ours. We are then to believe that we receive the blessing,
 254 because our faith has hold of it, and according to the Word it is ours.
 255 “What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive
 256 them, and ye shall have them.” Mark 11:24. Here is faith, naked
 257 faith, to believe that we receive the blessing, even before we realize
 258 it. When the promised blessing is realized and enjoyed, faith is
 259 swallowed up.” *Early Writings*, 72.2

260

261 5. We must obey.

262

263 1 John 3:22 “...we receive ... because we keep His
 264 commandments....”

265

266 “True faith rests on the promises contained in the Word of God, and
 267 those only who obey that Word can claim its glorious promises. "If
 268 ye abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye
 269 will, and it shall be done unto you." John 15:7. "Whatsoever we ask,
 270 we receive of Him, because we keep His commandments, and do
 271 those things that are pleasing in His sight." 1 John 3:22.” *Early*
 272 *Writings*, 72.2

273

274 “...only as we live in obedience to His word can we claim the
 275 fulfillment of His promises. ... If we render to Him only a partial,
 276 halfhearted obedience, His promises will not be fulfilled to us.”
 277 *Ministry of Healing*, 227.1

278

279 “We must daily compare our character with the law of God, the
 280 great rule of righteousness; and if that does not condemn us, we may
 281 approach the throne of grace in faith. We may plead that we have
 282 complied with the conditions, and now claim the fulfillment of the
 283 divine promises. “If ye abide in me,” says Christ, “and my words
 284 abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto
 285 you.” There is no place or excuse for a doubt. The promise is
 286 positive, and the rich blessings of Heaven are ours to enjoy.” *Review*
 287 *and Herald*, December 22, 1885, par. 1

288

289 6. We must live out our prayers.

290

291 “Children and youth may come to Jesus with their burdens and
 292 perplexities, and know that He will respect their appeals to Him, and
 293 give them the very things they need. Be earnest; be resolute. Present
 294 the promise of God, and then believe without a doubt. Do not wait to
 295 feel special emotions before you think the Lord answers. Do not
 296 mark out some particular way that the Lord must work for you
 297 before you believe you receive the things you ask of Him; but trust
 298 His word, and leave the whole matter in the hands of the Lord, with
 299 full faith that your prayer will be honored, and the answer will come
 300 at the very time and in the very way your heavenly Father sees is for
 301 your good; and then live out your prayers. Walk humbly and keep
 302 moving forward.” *Messages to Young People*, 123.1

303

304 “After we have offered our petitions, we are to answer them
 305 ourselves as far as possible, and not wait for God to do for us what
 306 we can do for ourselves.” *My Life Today*, 19.3

307

308 What Hinders Answers From Coming?

309

Introduction:

310

311 Ps. 66:18 “If I regard iniquity....”

312 Prov. 28:9 “One who turns away his ear from hearing the law, even
 313 his prayer *is* an abomination.”

314

315 “There are thousands of prayers daily offered that God does not
 316 answer. There are faithless prayers. “He that cometh to God must
 317 believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently
 318 seek him.” There are selfish prayers, proceeding from a heart that is
 319 cherishing idols. “If any man regard iniquity in his heart, the Lord
 320 will not hear him.” There are petulant, fretful prayers, murmuring
 321 because of the burdens and cares of life, instead of humbly seeking
 322 grace to lighten them. Those who offer such petitions are not
 323 abiding in Christ. They have not submitted their will to the will of
 324 God. They do not comply with the condition of the promise, and it is
 325 not fulfilled to them.” *Review and Herald*, September, 11, 1883 par.
 326 15

327

328

Hindering Factors Of The Past and Present

329

330 1. What were some of the obstacles in Isaiah’s day?

331

332 Isaiah 59:1,2 “Your iniquities have separated you....”

333 Isaiah 1:15-17 "...when ye make many prayers, I will not hear; your
334 hands are full of blood."

335

336 "If we regard iniquity in our hearts, if we cling to any known sin, the
337 Lord will not hear us; but the prayer of the penitent, contrite soul is
338 always accepted. When all known wrongs are righted, we may
339 believe that God will answer our petitions." *Steps to Christ*, 95

340

341 "Many think they have not time to pray, or that it would be useless
342 to pray if they had time. They indulge themselves in the gratification
343 of unholy desires. They cherish unchristlike traits of character, and
344 the least crossing of their will arouses their combativeness and
345 upsets their temper. While they are thus unemptied of self, and
346 unwilling to renounce their evil way, they cannot expect to receive
347 answers to their prayers; for evil tempers and corrupt indulgences
348 will make prayer of none effect. The psalmist says, 'If I regard
349 iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me.'" *Bible Echo*,
350 February 15, 1893 par. 7

351

352 "Fasting and prayer will accomplish nothing while the heart is
353 estranged from God by a wrong course of action." *Testimonies for*
354 *the Church*, vol. 2, 145.1

355

356 2. What obstacles are listed in Isaiah 58?

357

358 Isa. 58:3 "find pleasure and exploit...."

359 Isa. 58:6,7 "Loose the bonds of wickedness...."

360 Isa. 58:13 "If you turn your foot from the Sabbath...."

361

362 "I pray that my brethren may realize that the third angel's message
363 means much to us and that the observance of the true Sabbath is to
364 be the sign that distinguishes those who serve God from those who
365 serve Him not. ... Upon us rests the solemn obligation of taking a
366 more decided stand for truth and righteousness than we have taken
367 in the past. The line of demarcation between those who keep the
368 commandments of God and those who do not is to be revealed with
369 unmistakable clearness." *Testimonies for the Church* vol. 7, p 108.1

370

371 Note the promise given in Isaiah:

372 Isa. 58:8 "Then your light shall break forth...."

373

374 3. What were some of the obstacles in the days of Jeremiah?

375 (Idolatry, stubborn disobedience, ignoring the true prophet of God,
376 following false prophets and mocking the truth)

377

378 Jer. 7:17-18 "...fathers kindle the fire, and the women knead dough,
379 to make cakes for the queen of heaven...."

380 Jer. 23-26 "Sent to you all My servants the prophets, daily rising up
381 early and sending them. ²⁶ Yet they did not obey Me or incline their
382 ear, but stiffened their neck. They did worse than their fathers."

383 Jer. 7:28 "This is a nation that does not obey the voice of the LORD
384 their God nor receive correction."

385 Jer. 7:30 "They have set their abominations in the house which is
386 called by My name, to pollute it."

387 Jer. 8:5,6 "They hold fast to deceit, they refuse to return"

388 Jer. 8:10 "Everyone is given to covetousness; from the prophet even
389 to the priest everyone deals falsely."

390 Jer. 9:13 "...Because they have forsaken My law which I set before
391 them, and have not obeyed My voice, nor walked according to it...."

392 Jer. 17:21-23 "Hallow the Sabbath day, as I commanded your
393 fathers. ²³ But they did not obey nor incline their ear, but made their
394 neck stiff, that they might not hear nor receive instruction."

395 Jer. 5:31 "The prophets *prophesy falsely*, and the priests *rule by*
396 *their own power*; and My people love to have it so. But what will
397 you do in the end?"

398 2 Chron. 36:15,16 "But they *mocked the messengers* of God,
399 *despised His words*, and *scoffed at His prophets*, until the wrath of
400 the LORD arose against His people, *till there was no remedy*."

401 Jer. 7:16 "Therefore do not pray for this people, nor lift up a cry or
402 prayer for them, nor make intercession to Me; for I will not hear
403 you." (See Jer. 11:14)

404 Jer. 15:1 "Even if Moses were here, I would not listen."

405

406 "How much means are spent for things that are mere idols, things
407 that engross the thoughts and affections, little ornaments that require
408 attention to be kept free from dust and placed in order. The moments
409 spent in arranging these little idols might be spent in speaking a
410 word in season to some soul, awakening an interest to inquire,
411 "What shall I do to be saved?" These little things take the time that
412 should be devoted to prayer, seeking the Lord, and grasping by faith
413 the promises. . . ." *Evangelism*, 344.3

414

415 "An idol is anything that human beings love and trust in instead of
416 loving and trusting in the Lord their Maker. Whatever earthly thing
417 men desire and trust in as having power to help them and do them

418 good, leads them away from God, and is to them an idol. Whatever
419 divides the affections, or takes away from the soul the supreme love
420 of God, or interposes to prevent unlimited confidence and entire
421 trust in God, assumes the character and takes the form of an idol in
422 the soul temple.” *Selected Messages*, vol. 3, 330.2

423

424 “God is true to his covenant with his people. His word is infallible.
425 His people bring suffering on themselves by forsaking his counsel
426 for their own human wisdom. It is impossible for their prayers to
427 reach his throne, because the rebellion of disobedience is the
428 substance of their petitions. Christ came from heaven to teach the
429 word which his Father committed to him for the fallen members of
430 his family. Those who hear and obey walk in safe paths, under the
431 protection of the Lord of heaven.” *Review and Herald*, April 8, 1902
432 par. 12

433

434 I am instructed to say to our churches, Study the *Testimonies*. They
435 are written for our admonition and encouragement, upon whom the
436 ends of the world are come. If God's people will not study these
437 messages that are sent to them from time to time, they are guilty of
438 rejecting light. Line upon line, precept upon precept, here a little and
439 there a little, God is sending instruction to His people. Heed the
440 instruction; follow the light. The Lord has a controversy with His
441 people because in the past they have not heeded His instruction and
442 followed His guidance. *Selected Messages*, vol. 3, 358

443

444 “God cannot approve of the least degree of covetousness or
445 selfishness, and He abhors the prayers and exhortations of those who
446 indulge these evil traits.” *Early Writings*, p. 268.1

447

448 “There is too much mocking the Lord, too much praying that is no
449 praying and that wearies angels and displeases God, too many vain,
450 unmeaning petitions. First we should feel needy, and then ask God
451 for the very things we need, believing that He gives them to us, even
452 while we ask; and then our faith will grow, all will be edified, the
453 weak will be strengthened, and the discouraged and desponding
454 made to look up and believe that God is a rewarder of all those who
455 diligently seek Him.” *Early Writings*, 115.1

456

457 “All our prayers will be in vain while we cherish feelings of envy,
458 jealousy, suspicion, and enmity. We shall be forgiven only as we
459 forgive. It is no better than mocking God to engage in religious
460 worship with hearts thinking evil, and full of bitterness toward our

461 brethren or our fellow-men.” *Review and Herald*, November 6, 1883
 462 par. 9

463

464 Note the following promises:

465 Jer. 7:23 “Obey My voice, and I will be your God, and you shall be
 466 My people. And walk in all the ways that I have commanded you,
 467 that it may be well with you.”

468 Jer. 17:24-26 “...but hallow the Sabbath day, to do no work in it,
 469 then shall enter the gates of this city kings and princes sitting on the
 470 throne of David, riding in chariots and on horses....”

471 Jer. 29:11-14 “You will seek Me and find *Me*, when you search for
 472 Me with all your heart. I will be found by you, says the LORD, and I
 473 will bring you back from your captivity....”

474 Jer. 31:31-34 “...after those days, says the LORD: I will put My law
 475 in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God,
 476 and they shall be My people.”

477

478 4. What were the obstacles in the days of Haggai?

479 (Worldly priorities)

480

481 Hag. 1:2-11 “...to dwell in your paneled houses and this temple....”

482

483 “God cannot approve of the least degree of covetousness or
 484 selfishness, and He abhors the prayers and exhortations of those who
 485 indulge these evil traits. As Satan sees that his time is short, he leads
 486 men on to be more and more selfish and covetous, and then exults as
 487 he sees them wrapped up in themselves, close, penurious, and
 488 selfish. If the eyes of such could be opened, they would see Satan in
 489 hellish triumph, exulting over them and laughing at the folly of
 490 those who accept his suggestions and enter his snares.” *Early*
 491 *Writings*, 268.1

492

493 Note the promise:

494 Hag. 2:4 “Be strong....”

495

496 5. What hindered in the days of Zechariah?

497 (Refused to listen to the prophets, oppression and hardened their
 498 hearts)

499

500 Zech. 7:7 “Should you not have obeyed the words which the Lord
 501 proclaimed through the former prophets...”

502 Zech. 7:9,10 “Execute true justice, show mercy and compassion

504 the alien or the poor. Let none of you plan evil in his heart against
505 his brother.”

506 Zech. 7:11,12 “But they refused to heed, shrugged their shoulders,
507 and stopped their ears so that they could not hear. 12 Yes, they made
508 their hearts like flint, refusing to hear the law and the words which
509 the Lord of hosts had sent by His Spirit through the former prophets.
510 Thus great wrath came from the Lord of hosts. 13 Therefore it
511 happened, that just as He proclaimed and they would not hear, so
512 they called out and I would not listen,” says the Lord of hosts.”

513

514 “God will hold the church at ----- responsible, as a body, for the
515 wrong course of its members. If a selfish and unsympathizing spirit
516 is allowed to exist in any of its members toward the unfortunate, the
517 widow, the orphan, the blind, the lame, or those who are sick in
518 body or mind, He will hide His face from His people until they do
519 their duty and remove the wrong from among them. If any
520 professing the name of Christ so far misrepresent their Saviour as to
521 be unmindful of their duty to the afflicted, or if they in any way seek
522 to advantage themselves to the injury of the unfortunate and thus rob
523 them of means, the Lord holds the church accountable for the sin of
524 its members until they have done all they can to remedy the existing
525 evil. He will not hearken to the prayer of His people while the
526 orphan, the fatherless, the lame, the blind, and the sick are neglected
527 among them.” *Testimonies for the Church*, vol. 3, 517.2

528

529 Note the promise:

530 Zech. 8:15, 20-22 “Yes, many peoples and strong nations shall come
531 to seek the LORD of hosts in Jerusalem, and to pray before the
532 LORD.”

533

534 6. What were the obstacles in the days of Malachi?
535 (Blemished offerings, relational fractures and robbing God)

536

537 Mal. 1:6b-8 “You offer defiled food on My altar....”

538 Mal. 2:13-14 “...witness between you and the wife of your
539 youth....”

540 Mal. 3:7-10 “Will a man rob God?”

541

542 *Regarding making an unreserved surrender:*

543 “Paul had a keen sense of the conflict which every soul must wage
544 with the agencies of evil that are continually seeking to deceive and
545 ensnare, and he had worked untiringly to strengthen and confirm
546 those who were young in the faith. He had entreated them to make

547 an entire surrender to God; for he knew that when the soul fails to
548 make this surrender, then sin is not forsaken, the appetites and
549 passions still strive for the mastery, and temptations confuse the
550 conscience.” *Acts of the Apostles*, 298.2

551

552 “This is the preparation day. Set your own hearts in order, and work
553 earnestly for your children. An unreserved surrender to God will
554 sweep away the barriers that have so long defied the approaches of
555 heavenly grace. When you take up the cross and follow Christ, when
556 you bring your lives into conformity to the will of God, your
557 children will be converted.” *Review and Herald*, July 15, 1902, par.
558 13

559

560 *Regarding seeking after the heavenly pearl:*

561 “There are some who seem to be always seeking for the heavenly
562 pearl. But they do not make an entire surrender of their wrong
563 habits. They do not die to self that Christ may live in them.
564 Therefore they do not find the precious pearl. They have not
565 overcome unholy ambition and their love for worldly attractions.
566 They do not take up the cross and follow Christ in the path of self-
567 denial and sacrifice. Almost Christians, yet not fully Christians, they
568 seem near the kingdom of heaven, but they cannot enter there.
569 Almost but not wholly saved, means to be not almost but wholly

571

572 *Regarding marriage:*

573 “Whatever will make the character lovely in the home will make it
574 lovely in the heavenly mansion, and by your home life Jesus will
575 measure your religious life. The grace of Christ can make your
576 home a place of peace and rest, but unless you heed His Word and
577 cherish His Spirit, you are none of His. God requires you to be
578 sanctified wholly in your home life. The religion of Christ is not a
579 religion to be reserved for certain places and occasions, and then
580 laid aside at home. The truth as a sanctifier is needed more in the
581 home than in any other place. Every thought, every impulse, every
582 word and deed, is to be sanctified by the power of the truth.”

584

585 *Regarding returning God’s tithe:*

586 “As the Giver of every blessing, God claims a certain portion of all
587 we possess. This is His provision to sustain the preaching of the
588 gospel. And by making this return to God, we are to show our
589 appreciation of His gifts. But if we withhold from Him that which is

590 His own, how can we claim His blessing? If we are unfaithful
 591 stewards of earthly things, how can we expect Him to entrust us
 592 with the things of heaven? It may be that here is the secret of

594

595 “Hasten, my brethren and sisters, to bring to God a faithful tithe, and
 596 to bring Him also a willing thank offering. There are many who will

600 “The Bible does not condemn the rich man because he is rich; it
 601 does not declare the acquisition of wealth to be a sin, nor does it say

637 create bitter envy and strife; and while these differences exist, God
638 neither hears nor answers their prayers....” *Review & Herald* April
639 15, 1880

640

641 “When the laborers have an abiding Christ in their own souls, when
642 all selfishness is dead, when there is no rivalry, no strife for the
643 supremacy, when oneness exists, when they sanctify themselves, so
644 that love for one another is seen and felt, then the showers of the
645 grace of the Holy Spirit will just as surely come upon them as that
646 God's promise will never fail in one jot or tittle. But when the work
647 of others is discounted, that the workers may show their own

651

652 “In union there is strength; in disunion there is only weakness. We

657 ourselves to help one another. The Holy Spirit does not lead us into

661

662 “We have a character to maintain, but it is the character of Christ.
663 Having the character of Christ, we can carry on the work of God

679

680 Matt. 6:6 "...when you have shut your door...."

681

682 "When every other voice is hushed, and in quietness we wait before
 683 Him, the silence of the soul makes more distinct the voice of God.
 684 He bids us, 'Be still, and know that I am God.' Ps. 46:10. Here alone
 685 can true rest be found. And this is the effectual preparation for all
 686 who labor for God. Amid the hurrying throng, and the strain of life's
 687 intense activities, the soul that is thus refreshed will be surrounded
 688 with an atmosphere of light and peace. The life will breathe out
 689 fragrance, and will reveal a divine power that will reach men's
 690 hearts." *Desire of Ages*, 363

691

692 "Many, even in their seasons of devotion, fail of receiving the
 693 blessing of real communion with God. They are in too great haste.
 694 With hurried steps they press through the circle of Christ's loving
 695 presence, pausing perhaps a moment within the sacred precincts, but
 696 not waiting for counsel. They have no time to remain with the divine
 697 Teacher. With their burdens they return to their work." *Maranatha*,
 698 125

699

700 "Do not neglect secret prayer, for it is the soul of religion. With
 701 earnest, fervent prayer, plead for purity of soul. Plead as earnestly,
 702 as eagerly, as you would for your mortal life, were it at stake.
 703 Remain before God until unutterable longings are begotten within
 704 you for salvation, and the sweet evidence is obtained of pardoned

707 "Nothing will give such clear views of self as secret prayer. He who
 708 seeth in secret and knoweth all things, will enlighten your
 709 understanding and answer your petitions. Plain, simple duties that
 710 must not be neglected will open before you." *Testimonies for the*
 711 *Church*, vol. 5, 163

712

713 2. United Prayers

714

715 Matt. 18:20 "For where two or three are gathered...."

716

717 "Our Saviour ... promised that if two or three should be united in
 718 asking anything of God it should be given them. Christ here shows

719 that there must be union with others, even in our desires for a given
 720 object. ... There must be an agreement in the things which they
 721 desire and for which they pray. It was not merely the thoughts and
 722 exercises of one mind, liable to deception; but the petition was to be
 723 the earnest desire of several minds centered on the same point.”
 724 *Counsels for the Church*, 242.1

725

726 “I remember in Battle Creek when there were those who felt the
 727 burden for the unconverted, and those who were in darkness and
 728 saw no light; then prayer meetings were appointed that they might
 729 make the strength of God their strength. In every case the heavenly
 730 intelligences worked with these efforts, and souls were saved.”
 731 *Maranatha*, 38

732

733 “The promise is made on condition that the united prayers of the
 734 church are offered, and in answer to these prayers there may be
 735 expected a power greater than that which comes in answer to private
 736 prayer. The power given will be proportionate to the unity of the
 737 members and their love for God and for one another.” Letter 32,

739

740 “Let every one who give of his means, also send up his prayers daily

752

 756 midnight and say to him, ‘Friend, lend me three loaves....’”

757

758 “Every soul that refuses to give himself to God is under the control
 759 of another power. He is not his own. He may talk of freedom, but he
 760 is in the most abject slavery. He is not allowed to see the beauty of
 761 truth, for his mind is under the control of Satan. While he flatters

762 himself that he is following the dictates of his own judgment, he
763 obeys the will of the prince of darkness. Christ came to free the
764 shackles of sin-slavery from the soul. ‘If the Son therefore shall
765 make you free, you shall be free indeed.’” *Desire of Ages*, 466

766

767 “I have been shown angels of God are ready to impart grace and
768 power to those who feel their need of divine strength. But these
769 heavenly messengers will not bestow blessings unless solicited.
770 They have waited for the cry from souls hungering and thirsting for

772 indeed, casual prayers, but not the earnest supplication from humble,

775 “Let your prayers follow the servants of God like sharp sickles in

779

780 “The record shows that prayers of faith, though offered by frail
781 human beings, have power with God. The earnest cry, “I will not let

786 4. Pleading For Children

787

792

793 “The father who is the “house band” of the family will bind his
794 children to the throne of God by living faith. Distrusting his own
795 strength, he hangs his helpless soul on Jesus and takes hold of the
796 strength of the Most High. Brethren, pray at home, in your family,
797 night and morning; pray earnestly in your closet; and while engaged
798 in your daily labor, lift up the soul to God in prayer. It was thus that
799 Enoch walked with God. The silent, fervent prayer of the soul will
800 rise like holy incense to the throne of grace and will be as acceptable
801 to God as if offered in the sanctuary. To all who thus seek Him,
802 Christ becomes a present help in time of need. They will be strong
803 in the day of trial.” *Testimonies for the Church*, 616.1

804

805 “Did mothers but realize the importance of their mission, they would
806 be much in secret prayer, presenting their children to Jesus,
807 imploring His blessing upon them, and pleading for wisdom to
808 discharge aright their sacred duties.” *Adventist Home*, 265.4

809

810 “The power of a mother’s prayers cannot be too highly estimated.
811 She who kneels beside her son and daughter through the vicissitudes
812 of childhood, through the perils of youth, will never know till the
813 judgment the influence of her prayers upon the life of her children.”
814 *Signs of the Times*, March 16, 1891, par. 5

815

816 5. Overcoming Prayers

817

818 “Before the believer is held out the wonderful possibility of being
819 like Christ, obedient to all the principles of the law. But of himself
820 man is utterly unable to reach this condition. The holiness that
821 God’s word declares he must have before he can be saved is the
822 result of the working of divine grace as he bows in submission to the
823 discipline and restraining influences of the Spirit of truth. Man’s
824 obedience can be made perfect only by the incense of Christ’s
825 righteousness, which fills with divine fragrance every act of
826 obedience. The part of the Christian is to persevere in overcoming
827 every fault. Constantly he is to pray to the Saviour to heal the
828 disorders of his sin-sick soul. He has not the wisdom or the strength
829 to overcome; these belong to the Lord, and He bestows them on
830 those who in humiliation and contrition seek Him for help.” *Acts of*

832

833 “Prayer brings Jesus to our side, and gives new strength and fresh
834 grace to the fainting, perplexed soul to overcome the world, the flesh
835 and the devil. Prayer turns aside the attacks of Satan.” *Spaulding*
836 *Magan Collection*, 67.2

837

838 “When temptations and trials rush in upon us, let us go to God and
839 agonize with Him in prayer. He will not turn us away empty, but
840 will give us grace and strength to overcome, and to break the power
841 of the enemy. Oh, that all could see these things in their true light
842 and endure hardness as good soldiers of Jesus! Then would Israel
843 move forward, strong in God, and in the power of His might.” *Early*
844 *Writings*, 46.2

848 6. Reviving Prayers

849

850 Zech. 10:1 "Ask the Lord for rain in the time of the latter rain."

851 Isa. 44:3 "I will pour water on him who is thirsty...."

852

853 "A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most
 854 urgent of all our needs. To seek this should be our first work. There
 855 must be earnest effort to obtain the blessing of the Lord, not because
 856 God is not willing to bestow His blessing upon us, but because we
 857 are unprepared to receive it. Our heavenly Father is more willing to
 858 give His Holy Spirit to them that ask Him, than are earthly parents
 859 to give good gifts to their children. But it is our work, by confession,
 860 humiliation, repentance, and earnest prayer, to fulfill the conditions
 861 upon which God has promised to grant us His blessing. A revival
 862 need be expected only in answer to prayer." *Selected Messages*, vol.
 863 1, 121

864

865 "A revival need be expected only in answer to prayer. When
 866 churches are revived, it is because some individual seeks earnestly
 867 for the blessing of God. He hungers and thirsts after God, and asks
 868 in faith, and receives accordingly. He goes to work in earnest,
 869 feeling his great dependence upon the Lord, and souls are aroused to
 870 seek for a like blessing, and a season of refreshing falls upon the
 871 hearts of men." *Home Missionary*, November 1, 1890

872

873 7. Healing Prayers

874

875 Gen. 20:17 : "So Abraham prayed to God; and God healed
 876 Abimelech, his wife, and his female servants. Then they bore
 877 children,..."

878 James 5:13-16 "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray."

879 I Cor. 11:28-30 "For this reason many are weak and sick among
 880 you, and many sleep."

881

882 a. We must pray.

883

884 "His disciples in this time are to pray for the sick as verily as His
 885 disciples of old prayed. And recoveries will follow, for "the prayer
 886 of faith shall save the sick." James 5:15. We need the Holy Spirit's
 887 power, the calm assurance of faith that can claim God's promises."
 888 *Review and Herald*, June 9, 1904

889

890 “When you neglect to pray for the sick, you deprive them of great
891 blessings; for angels of God wait to minister to these souls in
892 response to your petitions....” *Medical Ministry*, 195

893

894 “It has often been my privilege to pray with the sick. We should do
895 this much more often than we do. If more prayer were offered in our
896 sanitariums for the healing of the sick, the mighty power of the
897 Healer would be seen. Many more would be strengthened and
898 blessed, and many more acute sicknesses would be healed.” *Selected*
899 *Messages*, vol. 3, 295

900

901 “It is labor lost to teach people to look to God as a healer of their
902 infirmities, unless they are taught also to lay aside unhealthful
903 practices. In order to receive His blessing in answer to prayer, they
904 must cease to do evil and learn to do well.” *Ministry of Healing*, 226

905

906 b. We must seek God’s will.

907

908 “<It is not always safe to> ask for unconditional healing. Let your
909 prayer include this thought, “Lord thou knowest every secret of the
910 soul. Thou art acquainted with these persons, for Jesus their
911 Advocate, gave His life for them. He loves them better than we
912 possibly can. If therefore it is for Thy glory, and the good of these
913 afflicted ones to raise them up to health, we ask in the name of Jesus
914 that health may be given them at this time.” In a petition of this
915 kind, no lack of faith is manifested.” Manuscript 26a, 1892.8

916

917 c. The will must be placed on the side of healing.

918

919 “By the exercise of the willpower in placing themselves in right
920 relation to life, patients can do much to cooperate with the
921 physician’s efforts for their recovery. There are thousands who can
922 recover health if they will. The Lord does not want them to be sick.
923 He desires them to be well and happy, and they should make up
924 their minds to be well. *Mind Character and Personality*, vol. 2,
925 690.2 Often invalids can resist disease simply by refusing to yield
926 to ailments and settle down in a state of inactivity. Rising above
927 their aches and pains, let them engage in useful employment suited
928 to their strength. By such employment and the free use of air and
929 sunlight, many an emaciated invalid might recover health and
930 strength.—The Ministry of Healing, 246 (1905). *Mind Character*
931 *and Personality*, vol. 2, 690.3

932

933 d. Taking appropriate measures is not a denial of faith.

934

935 “In regard to the matter of prayer for the sick, many confusing ideas
936 are advanced. One says, "He who has been prayed for must walk out
937 in faith, giving God the glory, and making use of no remedies. If he
938 is at a health institute he should leave it at once." *Selected Messages*,
939 vol. 2, 345.1 I know that these ideas are wrong, and that if accepted
940 they would lead to many evils.” *Selected Messages*, vol. 2, 345.2

941

942 “It is no denial of faith to use rational remedies judiciously.”
943 *Selected Messages*, vol. 2, 346.2

944

945 “In praying for the sick, we are to pray that if it be God’s will, they
946 may be raised up, but if not, that He will give them His grace to
947 comfort, His presence to sustain them in their suffering. Many who
948 should set their house in order, neglect to do it when they have hope
949 that they will be raised to health in answer to prayer. Buoyed up by a
950 false hope, they do not feel the need of saying words of exhortation
951 to their children, parents, or friends, and it is a great misfortune.
952 Accepting the assurance that they should be healed when prayed for,
953 they dare not make a reference as to how their property should be
954 disposed of, how their family is to be cared for, or express any wish
955 concerning their matters of which they would speak if they thought
956 they should be removed by death. In this way disasters are brought
957 upon the family and friends. For many things are left unmentioned,
958 because they fear expressions on these points would be a denial of
959 their faith that should be understood. Believing that they will be
960 raised to health by prayer, they fail to make use of hygienic
961 measures that are in their power to use, fearing that it would be a
962 denial of their faith. I thank the Lord that it is our privilege to
963 cooperate with Him in the work of restoration, availing ourselves of
964 all possible advantages in the recovery of health. It is no denial of
965 our faith to place ourselves in the condition most favorable to
966 recovery.” *Spaulding-Magan Collection*, 7.1

967

968 8. Prayers That Include Fasting

969

970 Mark 9:29 “... This kind can come out by nothing except by prayer
971 and fasting.”

972

973 “When Peter also was imprisoned, the entire church engaged in
974 fasting and prayer.” *Acts of the Apostles*, 144

975

976 “For certain things fasting and prayer are recommended and
 977 appropriate. In the hand of God they are a means of cleansing the
 978 heart and promoting a receptive frame of mind. We obtain answers
 979 to our prayers because we humble our souls before God.”
 980 *Manuscript Releases*, vol. 20, 105

981

982 “The spirit of true fasting and prayer is the spirit which yields mind,
 983 heart, and will to God.” *Counsels on Diet and Foods*, 189

984

985 “Our brethren would receive a blessing in dispensing with or
 986 deferring one meal of the day, if necessary, in order that an hour or
 987 more might be devoted to testimony meeting. We used often to
 988 make the Sabbath a day of fasting and prayer, and we were greatly
 989 blessed in our worship.” *Manuscript Releases*, vol. 9, 96.3

990

991 “The true fasting which should be recommended to all, is abstinence
 992 from every stimulating kind of food, and the proper use of
 993 wholesome, simple food, which God has provided in abundance.”
 994 *Counsels on Diet and Foods*, 90

995

996 “All the fasting in the world will not take the place of simple trust in
 997 the word of God. "Ask," He says, "and ye shall receive." ... You are
 998 not called upon to fast forty days. The Lord bore that fast for you in
 999 the wilderness of temptation. There would be no virtue in such a
 1000 fast; but there is virtue in the blood of Christ.” *Counsels on Diet and*
 1001 *Foods*, 189

1003 9. Prayers Resisting Satan

1004

1005 James 4:7 “Resist the devil....”

1006 Col. 1:13 “He has delivered us....”

1007 1John 3:8 “...that He might destroy the works of the devil....”

1008 Rom. 16:20 “...will crush Satan under your feet....”

1009

1010 “The prayer of faith is the great strength of the Christian, and will
 1011 assuredly prevail against Satan. This is why he insinuates that we
 1012 have no need of prayer. The name of Jesus, our Advocate, he
 1013 detests; and when we earnestly come to Him for help, Satan's host is
 1014 alarmed. It serves his purpose well if we neglect the exercise of
 1015 prayer, for then his lying wonders are more readily received.”
 1016 *Testimonies for the Church*, vol. 1, 296.

1017

1019 resist every assault of the enemy.” *Selected Messages*, vol. 1, 103

1020

1021 “If you have faith like this, you will lay hold upon God's word, and
1022 upon all the helpful agencies He has appointed. Thus your faith will
1023 strengthen, and will bring to your aid the power of heaven. The
1024 obstacles that are piled by Satan across your path, though apparently
1025 as insurmountable as the eternal hills, shall disappear before the
1026 demand of faith. "Nothing shall be impossible unto you." *Desire of*
1027 *Ages*, 431.3

1028

1029 “If Satan sees he is in danger of losing one soul, he will exert
1030 himself to the utmost to keep that one. And when the individual is
1031 aroused to his danger, and, with distress and fervor, looks to Jesus
1032 for strength, Satan fears he shall lose a captive, and he calls a re-
1033 enforcement of his angels to hedge in the poor soul, and form a wall
1034 of darkness around him, that heaven's light may not reach him. But
1035 if the one in danger perseveres, and in helplessness and weakness
1036 casts himself upon the merits of the blood of Christ, Jesus listens to
1037 the earnest prayer of faith, and sends a re-enforcement of those
1038 angels which excel in strength to deliver him.” *Messages to Young*

1040

1041 “Satan cannot endure to have his powerful rival appealed to, for he
1042 fears and trembles before His strength and majesty. At the sound of
1043 fervent prayer, Satan's whole host trembles. He continues to call
1044 legions of evil angels to accomplish his object. And when angels,
1045 all-powerful, clothed with the armory of heaven, come to the help of
1046 the fainting, pursued soul, Satan and his host fall back, well
1047 knowing that their battle is lost. The willing subjects of Satan are
1048 faithful, active, and united in one object. And although they hate and
1049 war with one another, yet they improve every opportunity to
1050 advance their common interest. But the great Commander in heaven
1051 and earth has limited Satan's power.” *Counsels to the Church*, 319.3

1053 “God's servants need constantly to lay hold with one hand of souls
1054 ready to perish, while with the hand of faith they lay hold of the
1055 throne of God. Souls possessed with evil spirits will present
1056 themselves before us. We must cultivate the spirit of earnest prayer,
1057 mingled with genuine faith to save them from ruin, and this will
1058 confirm our faith. God designs that the sick, the unfortunate, those
1059 possessed with evil spirits, shall hear his voice through us. Through
1060 his human agents he desires to be a comforter such as the world has

1061 never before seen. His words are to be voiced by his followers: "Let
 1062 not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid. Ye believe in God,

1070 "Jacob prevailed because he was persevering and determined. His
 1071 victory is an evidence of the power of importunate prayer. All who
 1072 will lay hold of God's promises as he did, and be as earnest and
 1073 persevering as he was, will succeed as he succeeded. Those who are
 1074 unwilling to deny self, to agonize before God, to pray long and
 1075 earnestly for his blessing, will not obtain it. Wrestling with God—
 1076 how few know what it is! How few have ever had their souls drawn
 1077 out after God with intensity of desire until every power is on the
 1078 stretch. When waves of despair which no language can express
 1079 sweep over the suppliant, how few cling with unyielding faith to the
 1080 promises of God." *The Great Controversy*, 621.2

1081

1082 "The servant watched while Elijah prayed. Six times he returned
 1083 from the watch, saying, There is nothing, no cloud, no sign of rain.
 1084 But the prophet did not give up in discouragement. He kept
 1085 reviewing his life, to see where he had failed to honor God, he
 1086 confessed his sins, and thus continued to afflict his soul before God,
 1087 while watching for a token that his prayer was answered. As he
 1088 searched his heart, he seemed to be less and less, both in his own
 1089 estimation and in the sight of God. It seemed to him that he was
 1090 nothing, and that God was everything; and when he reached the
 1091 point of renouncing self, while he clung to the Saviour as his only
 1092 strength and righteousness, the answer came." *Review and Herald*,

1113 “We do not pray any too much, but we are too sparing of giving
1114 thanks. If the loving kindness of God called forth more thanksgiving
1115 and praise, we would have far more power in prayer. We would
1116 abound more and more in the love of God and have more bestowed
1117 to praise Him for. You who complain that God does not hear your
1118 prayers, change your present order and mingle praise with your
1119 petitions. When you consider His goodness and mercies you will
1120 find that He will consider your wants.” *Testimonies for the Church*,
1121 vol. 5, 317

1122

1123 “When difficulties and trials surround us, we should flee to God, and
1124 confidently expect help from Him who is mighty to save and strong
1125 to deliver. We must ask for God’s blessing if we would receive it.
1126 Prayer is a duty and a necessity; but do we not neglect praise?
1127 Should we not oftener render thanksgiving to the Giver of all our
1128 blessings? We need to cultivate gratitude. We should frequently
1129 contemplate and recount the mercies of God, and laud and glorify
1130 His holy name, even when we are passing through sorrow and
1131 affliction. . . .” *Selected Messages*, vol. 2, 268

1132

1133 “To praise God in fulness and sincerity of heart is as much a duty as
1134 is prayer. We are to show to the world and to all the heavenly
1135 intelligences that we appreciate the wonderful love of God ..., and
1136 that we are expecting larger and yet larger blessings from His
1137 infinite fulness. . . . After a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit, our
1138 joy in the Lord and our efficiency in His service would be greatly
1139 increased by recounting His goodness and His wonderful works in
1140 behalf of His children. These exercises drive back the power of
1141 Satan. They expel the spirit of murmuring and complaint, and the
1142 tempter loses ground. ... No more effective means can be employed

1152 “In reading the history of the past year’s labor, I saw distinctly how
1153 much the laborers had lost through a lack of faith; how much they
1154 could have asked of God, and how willingly he would have
1155 bestowed his grace upon them in answer to their humble prayers of
1156 faith.” *Review and Herald*, April 13, 1886, par. 7

1157

1158 “We are in duty bound to draw largely from the treasure house of
1159 divine knowledge. God wants us to receive much, in order that we
1160 may impart much. He desires us to be channels through which He
1161 can impart richly of His grace to the world. Let sincerity and faith
1162 characterize your prayers. The Lord is willing to do for us
1163 “exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think.” Ephesians
1164 3:20. Talk it; pray it. Do not talk unbelief. We cannot afford to let
1165 Satan see that he has power to darken our countenances and sadden
1166 our lives. Pray in faith. And be sure to bring your lives into harmony
1167 with your petitions, that you may receive the blessings for which
1168 you pray. Let not your faith weaken, for the blessings received are
1169 proportionate to the faith exercised. “According to your faith be it
1170 unto you.” “All things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing,
1171 ye shall receive.” Matthew 9:29; 21:22. Pray, believe, rejoice. Sing
1172 praises to God because He has answered your prayers. Take Him at
1173 His word. “He is faithful that promised.” Hebrews 10:23. Not one
1174 sincere supplication is lost. The channel is open; the stream is
1175 flowing. It carries with it healing properties, pouring forth a
1176 restoring current of life and health and salvation.” *Testimonies for
1177 the Church*, vol. 7, 273 3,4; 274.1
