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Guidance God’s Will and Prayer

1 God Has Promised To Answer

2 1 John 5:14,15 “And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if
3 we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us: And if we know
4 that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the peti-
5 tions that we desired of him.”

6 1 John 3:22 “And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we
7 keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his
8 sight.”

9 “He makes it plain that our asking must be according to God's will; we
10 must ask for the things that He has promised, and whatever we receive
11 must be used in doing His will. The conditions met, the promise is un-
12 equivocal.” *Education*, p. 257.7

13 “When we pray for earthly blessings, the answer to our prayer may be
14 delayed, or God may give us something other than we ask, but not so
15 when we ask for deliverance from sin. It is His will to cleanse us from
16 sin, to make us His children, and to enable us to live a holy life.” *De-*
17 *sire of Ages*, p. 266.2

18 The Steps To Knowing God’s Will

19 1. God wants His will to be perfectly accomplished in our lives:

20 Colossians 4:12 “That ye may stand perfect and complete in all the
21 will of God.”

22 2. God is willing to give wisdom:

23 James 1:5 “If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives
24 to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him.”

25 3. Accepting God’s direction brings true and enduring happiness.

26 John 13:17 “If you know these things, blessed are you if you do

27 them.”

28 4. We must be completely open to whatever God wants. To do so, it is
29 best to have no will of our own on the matter:

30 Luke 9:23 "If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself, take
31 up his cross daily, and follow Me."

32 5. God will never lead contrary to what is taught in the Bible:

33 Isaiah 8:20: "To the law and to the testimony! If they do not speak ac-
34 cording to this word, it is because there is no light in them."

35 6. God will providentially direct us by opening and closing doors:

36 Proverbs 3:6: "In all you ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct
37 your paths."

38 7. The Holy Spirit will make impressions upon the heart:

39 John 10:27 "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they fol-
40 low Me."

41 8. When God is leading, His peace will rule in our hearts. Lack of
42 peace is an important indicator that what we are pursuing may not be
43 God's will, or that it is not yet God's time:

44 Colossians 3:15: "And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to
45 which also you were called in one body; and be thankful."

46 9. It is often wise to share God's leadings with a mature and surren-
47 dered Christian, to ascertain if we are correctly understanding God's
48 leading:

49 Proverbs 11:14 "In the multitude of counselors there is safety."

50 10. As God leads us forward He often only shows us one step at a
51 time.

52 Isa. 30:21 "Your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, 'This is
53 the way, walk in it, whenever you turn to the right hand whenever you
54 turn to the left.'"

55 11. Confirmation—NOT direction—is sometimes gained in seeking a
56 fleece.

57 Judges 6:37 "Look, I shall put a fleece of wool on the threshing floor;
58 if there is dew on the fleece only, and it is dry on all the ground, then I
59 shall know that You will save Israel by my hand, as You have said."

60 Other Thoughts On Knowing God's Will

61 God Reveals His Will Three Ways

62 "There are three ways in which the Lord reveals His will to us, to
63 guide us, and to fit us to guide others. How may we know His voice
64 from that of a stranger? How shall we distinguish it from the voice of
65 a false shepherd? **God reveals His will to us in His word, the Holy**
66 **Scriptures. His voice is also revealed in His providential workings;**
67 and it will be recognized if we do not separate our souls from Him by
68 walking in our own ways, doing according to our own wills, and fol-
69 lowing the promptings of an unsanctified heart, until the senses have
70 become so confused that eternal things are not discerned, and the
71 voice of Satan is so disguised that it is accepted as the voice of God.

72 Another way in which God's voice is heard is **through the appeals of**
73 **His Holy Spirit, making impressions upon the heart, which will be**
74 **wrought out in the character.** If you are in doubt upon any subject
75 you must first consult the Scriptures. If you have truly begun the life
76 of faith you have given yourself to the Lord to be wholly His, and He
77 has taken you to mold and fashion according to His purpose, that you
78 may be a vessel unto honor. You should have an earnest desire to be
79 pliable in His hands and to follow whithersoever He may lead you.
80 You are then trusting Him to work out His designs, while at the same
81 time you are co-operating with Him by working out your own salva-
82 tion with fear and trembling. You, my brother, will find difficulty here
83 because you have not yet learned by experience to know the voice of
84 the Good Shepherd, and this places you in doubt and peril. You ought
85 to be able to distinguish His voice."—*Testimonies* Vol. 5, p. 512.1,2

86 We Must Trust God

87 "Many who profess to be Christ's followers have an anxious, troubled
88 heart, because they are afraid to trust themselves with God. They do
89 not make a complete surrender to Him; for they shrink from the conse-
90 quences that such a surrender may involve. Unless they do make this
91 surrender, they cannot find peace.... **Worry is blind, and cannot dis-**
